

Final Project Scoring

Here is a reiteration of the specifications for the final web-site project including how each required feature will be scored. To get 100 on the project, you must meet all the criteria below. If you do a bang-up job, I might add up to 25 additional bonus points!

- **Subject:** your choice, but I expect to see a unified theme, e.g. My Dogs, My Favorite Bands, My Favorite Books/TV Shows, My Crazy Relatives, etc. You can, of course, do a web site for a flower shop, bakery, travel agency, etc. if you prefer.
 - 10 points if the page (any page) exists
 - 15 points if you have a common theme
- **Length:** Five (5) pages, e.g. home page giving a site overview or summary and then four more pages, each of which features one dog, band, book, crazy relative, contact info, etc.
 - 15 points for 5 or more pages. 3 pts/page if fewer than 5 pages
- **Consistent look and lay out** on all pages
 - Use linked style sheet to enforce this
 - Use semantic markup, i.e. avoid in-line styles or slapping class declarations on each <p> tag
 - 15 points for having a consistent *look*
- **Unified navigation** scheme, e.g. some kind of common navigation bar at top or along the side of each page. Simple text-based links are fine.
 - 15 points
- **graphic objects:** at least two, positioned appropriately to the text, e.g. if you don't begin talking about a particular dog/crazy relative until the third paragraph, then the picture should be positioned on the level of the third paragraph.
 - 15 points:
 - 10 pts for the images
 - 5 pts for positioning and alt tags
- **address/contact footer:** with an e-mail link on *each* page
 - 15 points (3 pts/page)
- **Due Date:**
 - The due date is the last day of class, i.e. **12 May**. I'm sorry I can't provide more slack, but I'll be out of town after that and won't be able to grade your projects.
